2007 Joint Transportation Symposium

Four students attended this District 6 Annual Meeting. The conference sessions ranged from traffic engineering and operations to transportation planning and transit. Other sessions were also offered that covered special topics, traffic safety, ITS applications, pedestrians, and bicyclists.

All students also participated in the James H. Kell Student Competition, which consisted of the construction of a bridge built from newspaper. Students were broken into groups and given a limited number of supplies. These supplies were used to construct the best product that would support the most pop cans. The students were judged on how many pop cans each bridge could hold when placed across two chairs. Tao Zhong, a University of Wyoming student was in the group that placed first in the competition.

Gregg Fredrick, the State Bridge Engineer from the Wyoming Department of Transportation gave a presentation concerning the state of the Clark Street Viaduct in Laramie, Wyoming. After the high media coverage of the Minnesota bridge collapse, there was much concern about the safety of this bridge in Laramie which is a main connection between West Laramie and the rest of the city. This topic had been covered in the local newspapers and was of high interest around the college. The meeting had to be moved to a larger room with more seating in order to accommodate the approximate 80 people in attendance.
